

During this topic, we will:





- Look at logos of different shops and toys.

Understanding the World (UW)

People and Communities

We will:

- Explore different cultures, and their places of
- Think about how we celebrate Christmas at home and compare our celebrations with those of other families and cultures.
- Show an interest in different occupations.

The World:

- Walk to the church in the afternoon of Monday 11th November, taking our poppies and laying them on the memorial.
- Take part in a welly walk around the school grounds; use our senses to explore.
- Begin to understand the need to respect and care for the natural environment and all living things.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development (PSED)

Our topic for PHSE this half term is Rights and Responsibilities We will be thinking about:

- Personal hygiene when cooking. Why do we wash our hands?.
- Our own safety when using cooking utensils
- Road safety when crossing roads.

Expressive Arts and Design (EAD)

We will:

- Explore different materials freely, in order to develop our ideas about how to use them and what to make.
- Make Remembrance poppies from card and buttons.
- Explore different textures when making Christmas cards and decorations
- Learn some Christmas songs and perform them.

Mathematics (M)

- Learn to use positional language to describe everyday items e.g. in, beside, on top, behind.
- Explore the different sizes of utensils and ingredients. Measure ingredients, looking at the numbers that appear on the scales.
- Continue to count everything! (fingers, number of family members, items in the shop) and using the number names. Focus on numbers 1-5, counting objects and matching numerals.

Physical Development (PD)

We will:

Practice putting on our own outdoor clothes e.g. hats, coats and wellington boots, doing up zips.



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- During physical sessions, we will challenge our bodies, using gross motor skills on the climbing equipment focusing on our balancing skills.
- Learn to use a variety of utensils and tools for eating and cooking e.g. knives and forks, large spoons, rolling pins to make Christmas biscuits.


Communication and Language (CL)

- Listen to and follow verbal instructions, e.g. when going for a walk to the church or when following a recipe.
- Learn a selection of Christmas songs and perform them.
- Have fun, taking on different roles in our celebrations roleplay (inside) and Christmas grotto (outside)
