Maths




Learning how to use a number line to 20 for counting and to support addition and subtraction and how to estimate using a number line.

Comparing and ordering numbers within 20, identifying largest/smallest


Investigating missing number problems, using our knowledge of addition, subtraction and place value to help us.




RE-This term we will be focusing on Christianity, by learning about the Prophecy of God. We will under

Through this topic we will learn about the different continents, the oceans of the world, the equator and hot and cold countries.






What can you do at home?
